Subject: Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) Project Funding Recommendations

The group reviewed four (4) applications as follows:

| Applicant Name | Project Title | Federal Amount Requested |

| City of Fairbanks | Bicycle and Pedestrian Count Equipment | \$54,425 |
| City of Fairbanks | Bjerremark Sidewalk | \$102,788 |
| University of Alaska Fairbanks | Multi-Use Path Erosion Damage | \$68,269 |

After review of the above projects, all projects were found to be submitted by an eligible applicant, eligible in scope, provision of an adequate demonstration to a commitment to maintenance and provision of non-federal share by August 15, 2016 and acknowledgment that the project had to be developed under the rules of 23 USC.

FMATS has \$227,744 of federal TAP funds available this application period. The results of the evaluation of these proposals is listed below, in priority order, and are our recommendations for funding in this round of TAP Grants:
